Pre-Arrival

- Full details of how to reach us can be found by clicking here:
- If arriving by train both Central Station and Glasgow Queen St Station are 5-7 minutes walk from our building. A local taxi will cost around £5-6 for this journey.
- If arriving into Glasgow International Airport, we recommend the cityflyer express bus which will bring you to Buchanan Bus Station. The Bus Station is 3 minutes walk along Cowcaddens Road.

• The 6 and 6A busses stop directly opposite our building and can be taken from George Square or anywhere on Hope street after St Vincent Street junction.

External

- There are 2 entrances to the building. The National Piping Centre is for events, bagpiping lessons, museum visits and general enquiries. The Pipers' Tryst Hotel is for restaurant, bar and hotel stays.
- There are 4 accessible spaces to the left of our building. These are owned and operated by Glasgow City Council. They are taken on a first come first served basis.
- A drop off point at the main entrance.
- Luggage assistance available to all guests.
- There is a lift which can bring guests into the building from street level and to any floor within The National Piping Centre.
- If you choose to enter by the front of the building, both main entrances have steps and a handrail.

Reception

- A seating area is provided in the main reception area and within The Pipers' Tryst restaurant.
- Meetings and registration can take place seated in any of these areas.
- On checking in the manager will explain the layout of the building and how to use your keys.
- There is a side entrance once guests have checked in, for privacy and ease of access.
- The National Piping Centre has a marble floor and is well lit.
- The Pipers' Tryst has a wooden floor and carpeting and is well lit.
- There is carpeting throughout the rest of the building.
- Free WIFI available throughout the premises.

Bedrooms

- The Pipers' Tryst bedrooms are not wheelchair accessible.
- Guests can be allocated to the first floor if they prefer.
- All rooms have a comfortable chair and stool for the dressing table. These items
 of furniture can be removed if you require more space.
- All rooms have an en-suite bathroom, with WC, sink, bath and shower. Heater or heated towel rail and safe for personal belongings.
- All rooms offer complimentary WIFI.

Public areas

- Two accessible unisex toilets within the building.
- A lift which can be accessed by speaking to a staff member. A staff member will escort guests to the preferred level.
- All doors, entrances and corridors are wide enough for wheelchairs, walking frames and pushchairs.
- All corridors are well lit and level throughout.
- All main meeting rooms have a hearing loop system installed and portable seating arrangements.

Restaurants, Bar and Lounge

- The restaurant, bar and reception areas are all located on the ground floor and are level throughout.
- Chefs are able to accommodate any special dietary requirements.
- Menus are available in large print format or alternatively staff can talk through the choice of dishes on offer.
- All areas are spacious with a variety of seating arrangements.

Emergency Evacuation Procedures

- All exists on the ground floor.
- Assistance in the event of an evacuation is available if advanced arrangements are made with reception.
